

Printing Tips:

Print these pages 2 sided. My current printer does not print 2-sided, so I have to feed the papers manually. I arranged the pages so I can print pages 1-3 at once. If I'm making multiple calendars, I do not collate so I get a stack of page 1, etc. It will help if you pay attention to which direct the paper comes out of the printer. Mine come out with the printing up and the top edge first. So I can just flip my page as if turning a page in a book. The printing will still be right side up and the blank page is facing front. It might not be a bad idea to print an extra copy of page 1 in case you feed the other side wrong.



I've centered the calendar pages on the sheet of paper, so everything should line up correctly. But in case it's not precise or my printer prints at a little angle, there won't be any cutting lines to show on the second side.

And because my printer sometimes prints at a little angle, I line the cutting lines up on the 3 pages and then cut them all at once.

I have a long arm stapler so I can put the stamped cover on, crease in half, and staple on the crease. You could stitch the pages together or ask your local copy store to staple them.

Color Coding:

Red events are standard US holidays and religious holidays. Green events show Stampin' Up!® catalogs and OnStage. Purple events are fun holidays I thought might be fun to celebrate with a card. ©

You may want to write in the events you want to celebrate with a card. If you are a demonstrator, you might want to enter any events you have planned. If you are making calendars for others, you can make color copies.
