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Notes

- Score the Bermuda Bay card stock at 4¼". Then fold and crease for the card base.
- Stamp *Happy Birthday* in Night of Navy ink in the center of one piece of Whisper White. Adhere this panel inside the card.
- Color the Vellum with the Stampin' Blends™. I chose a pattern with each of the three colors. I was unsure of how dark I wanted it, so I used the light pen on one side and then decided to deepen the color with the dark pen on the other side of the paper.
- Use the Stamparatus with the "Hinge Step" method to stamp on the other Whisper White piece for the front panel.
 - The Hinge Step works great with any stamp that is about 1" high for a vertical pattern or 1" wide for a horizontal pattern.
 - Stamp. I selected the *Let's celebrate* stamp. These directions are for fading the stamp, but I think this image works if you reink each time. If you are reinking, you can start from the top and work down.
 - Place the card stock in the corner of the Stamparatus and hold with a magnet.
 - Position the stamp in line between the top two hinges and on the right side of the card stock. Move the plate down so the stamp is in the middle of the card, ink with Night of Navy ink, and stamp.
 - Move the plate up one hinge and stamp without re-inking (or re-ink each time for a different look.)
 - Move the plate so the stamp is one hinge step below the first image.
 - Then move back up one hinge step above the top image.
 - Repeat, moving above and below the previous images. You should end up with one central image that's dark and then gets lighter as it moves toward the top and bottom.
- Adhere the vellum to the left side of the front panel with Multipurpose Liquid Glue and a Stamping Sponge.
- Place the pegs of the Bow Maker with 3 holes between them. Tie the Black cord around the pages. Tie the cord in a square knot. You can use the D Block instead of the Bow Maker. Snip the cord at the half-way mark of the loop. Position the knot even with the darkest image. Wrap the ends behind the card and adhere.
- Add rhinestones to the circles under the darkest image.
- Adhere the front panel to the card front.

As a side note, I discovered the drop and dot stamp in this set is exactly 2 hinges apart. Position this border stamp on the line of the plate. Use the Hinge Step method, but move two hinges down, and re-ink as you go. You will get a continuous pattern. You can use this stamp and the Hinge Step to stamp the envelope.
