

Notes:

1. Score the Gray Granite card stock at $41 / 4$." Fold and crease for the card base.
2. On the side that is $41 / 4$ " Use the wider strip die to cut the edge.
a. This die cuts off one side. The side with the scallop should be right at the edge of the card stock.
b. When long narrow straight dies go through the machine parallel to the roller, they have a tendency to hop over the die.
c. When you run it through the die cutting machine, your card should be closed and the die should go in one end first and roll through the length of the die.
3. Cut a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 51 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ strip from the $53 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 4$ " Petal Pink card stock.
4. Cut one long side of the Petal Pink card stock with the open floral border.
a. This die also cuts on one side. There are extending pieces that are closer to the side that cuts.
b. The outermost leaves just barely fit on a $51 / 2$ " card so I used a slightly large piece of card stock.
c. Since this piece is not the full card size, you will be able to have this die go through the machine from one end to the other.
d. With the die stretching across the short direction of the plate, you will have to be careful that it doesn't extend past the edges.
e. Running this die from end to end gives you a much better cut easily.
5. Use the die that is closest to the $21 / 4 " \times 31 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Petal Pink card stock to cut the front label.
6. Stamp thanks in Gray Granite ink in the center of 1 " $\times 33 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ piece of Very Vanilla. Stamp you're amazing in the center of the $51 / 2^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{x}$ $35 /{ }^{\prime \prime}$ " Very Vanilla piece. Adhere the thin Petal Pink strip to the bottom of the piece. Adhere to the inside of the card.
7. Emboss the Petal Pink layer with the folder of your choice.
8. Wrap the ribbon across the middle of the Petal Pink layer and adhere the ends behind the card stock. Adhere to the card front
9. Adhere the stamped Very Vanilla piece to the smaller Petal Pink piece. Adhere over the ribbon
